General

The student publishes their own work in one or more relevant contexts, in one or more forms. The work, as a whole or significant parts of it, will be published in accordance with the approved project plan. In this module, the student presents their work to a qualified audience and leads a discussion on their work with invited audience. After this stage, the student will begin writing their report. In the module, the student will participate in a seminar on tools for publication.

Intended learning outcomes

After completion of the course, the student should:

- identify needs to further develop their own work, based on the feedback received from its publication
- demonstrate an ability to, orally, in writing or in some other way, clearly present and discuss their activities and artistic work in dialogue with different groups, users or recipients
- account for what their work could look like in another context
- demonstrate an ability to reason about how their individual work relates to broader societal, social and ethical issues
- Present, discuss and critically reflect on their own project for guest critics and a qualified audience

Course organisation and types of instruction:

Independent work in dialogue with supervisors, seminars, lectures, oral and visual presentations of work, individually adapted reading list.

Examination

Active participation during the presentation days.

Grading criteria

For a grade of "Pass", the student must:

- give an oral and visual presentation of how the work can be developed further using feedback from the publishing process.
