Main course content

The course focus on how historical strands within interior architecture and furniture design are activated in the students artistic process and development,

Intended learning outcomes

After completing the course, the student shall be able to:

- show understanding of how historical ideas and strands within design influences the student's own practice.

Entry requirements

General entry requirements. In addition, a passing grade is required in courses corresponding to 45 credits from year 1 in the bachelor's program interior architecture and furniture design.

Forms of examination

Examination takes place through a visual and oral/written presentation where the student, in a group or individually, in a reflective way tells about how design history can be activated in their own artistic process.

The examiner is responsible for developing grading criteria for the examination and for these to be published on the intranet.

Students who have received a failing grade on an exam have the right to take five additional exams as long as the course is given to achieve a passing grade. Students who have received a failing grade on an exam twice by an examiner have the right to request that another examiner be appointed to determine the grade on the exam. The petition is made to the head of department.
